Walking in Truth


1. What did you learn from our study in John 6:1-14 that you did not already know? What one change do you purpose to make in your life as a result of this study?

6. Do you see how Jesus always emphasizes the teaching and resulting conviction and life transformation? What causes a teaching or a teacher to arouse your mind and will? What about others you know or church folks or secular folks today? Whom do they follow and why?
