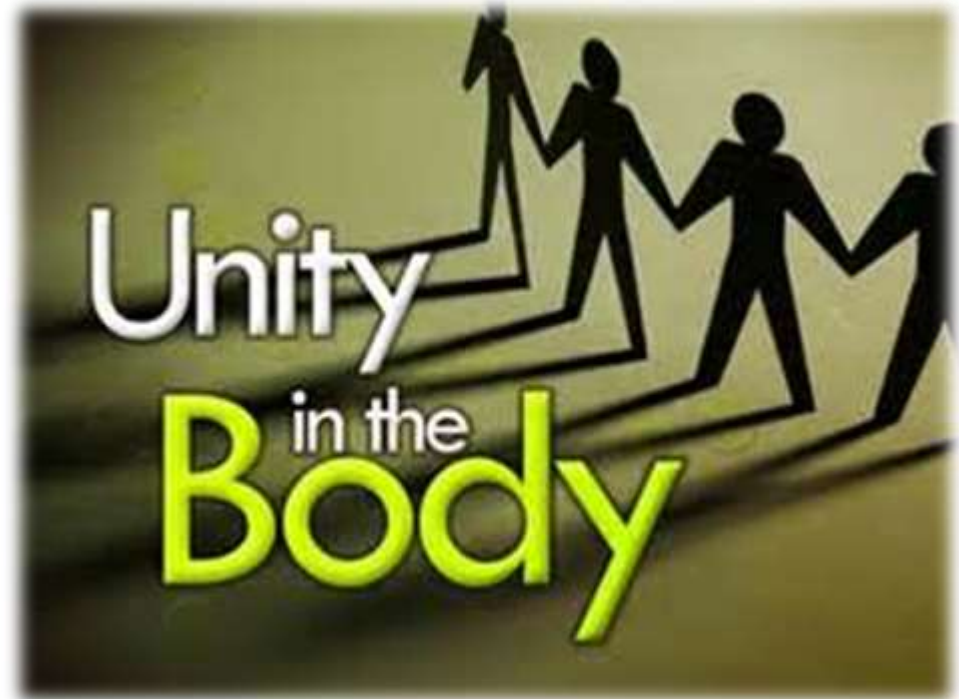


1. What did you learn from our study of Psalm 133 and Christian unity that you did not already know? What one change do you purpose to make in your life as a result of this study?
